THE SAVOY - A LUXURY HOTEL IN THE HEART OF LONDON



The *Savoy* opened on August 6,1889. It was the first hotel in Britain with electric lights and lifts installed throughout the building. Each beautifully furnished room had a bathroom with hot and cold running water. The owner hired César Ritz as the manager, and Auguste Escoffier as the chef to prepare excellent meals. These two men introduced standards of comfort and service which were not found in any other hotel in Europe at that time.



One of the rooms in the hotel is called the *Marlene Dietrich Suite* to honour the famous actress, who stayed at the hotel for a long time. Marlene Dietrich was an icon of Hollywood's Golden Age. Whenever Dietrich stayed at the *Savoy*, she asked for twelve pink roses to be sent to her room every day. To this day, her room is always supplied with pink roses.

Visitors to London as well as local people come to the hotel to enjoy its afternoon teas, which include classic sandwiches, scones and tarts made by famous chefs like Michael Turner. The dining room manifests elegance and the atmosphere makes you feel that you stepped back in time or into the setting of a historical film. It's not surprising, as the British habit of having something small to eat between lunch and dinner dates back to the early 1800s, and the *Savoy* continues this custom.

Like other hotels, the *Savoy* has a mascot. It is a 90-centimetre high wooden sculpture of a black cat called Kaspar. Kaspar's story began in 1898, after a dinner at the *Savoy* planned for 14 guests. One of the guests did not come, so there were only 13 people at the table that evening. Unfortunately, the first person who left the dinner died not long after. Therefore, to avoid bad luck, Kaspar was created to be the 14th guest whenever there are only 13 people at a meal in the *Savoy*.

The whole journey took five months, which means that Mack broke the Guinness World Record set by another person in 2021 and became the youngest pilot to fly around the world solo. Flying an ultralight plane with a cruising speed reaching 300 km/h, Mack experienced some problems, such as sandstorms in Sudan and extreme heat in Dubai. However, speaking of his trip, he said that flying is a dream that has always been shared by his family because they are all talented pilots. He added that it was his sister Zara, who encouraged him to take up the challenge. In January 2022, at the age of 19, his sister became the youngest woman to fly around the world solo.

Chatterton and Mattera were working happily in Santo Domingo when Bowden, an old treasure hunter, rang them and asked them to come to see him in Miami. There was something in his voice that told them they should go. After all, it was just a two-hour flight from Santo Domingo; they could be there and back the same day. If nothing else, Bowden told great stories, and in treasure hunting, stories were as good as real gold. So, they cancelled their appointments for that day, packed their bags, booked tickets, and set off.

In Miami, they rented a car and drove to Bowden's house. He wasn't like any other treasure hunter they'd met, as he usually worked alone and used almost no modern technology. Instead, he used old drawings, ageing equipment, and his own notes to find shipwrecks. During his career, Bowden had discovered not one but two treasure ships. That wasn't a record number of finds, but it was still impressive. As a successful treasure hunter, Bowden should have a house as large as a palace. But when Chatterton and Mattera pulled into Bowden's driveway, they were surprised. The house wasn't large and looked no different than any other in this ordinary street.

Inside, Bowden offered them coffee, but they weren't listening to him because everywhere they looked they saw treasure. In one room, there were silver coins; in another, old navigational instruments that museums would pay a fortune for. The plates in Bowden's dining room were from the 17th century, as good as a priceless set Mattera had seen in the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. Bowden showed them other things, each with a story. He let them touch everything, too. Finally, he asked the men to join him at the dining room table, and then they got down to business.

"Have you heard of Joseph Bannister?", he asked. The men shook their heads.

Bannister, Bowden explained, was an English sea captain in charge of transporting cargo between London and Jamaica in the late seventeenth century. One day, it is not known why, he stole the great ship he commanded, the *Golden Fleece*, and became a pirate in the Caribbean. The British authorities wanted to catch him any way they could. One day, two British ships found Bannister's ship and made a surprise attack. You would expect a pirate captain to give up in such a situation. But not Bannister. He and his crew fought for two days. They finally beat the British ships, which had to return to port in Jamaica. Bannister won the war but the *Golden Fleece* was damaged and quickly sank. Luckily, he escaped and was never heard of again. This victory made Bannister a legend. However, over time, his name was almost forgotten.

"This is the greatest pirate story ever," Bowden concluded. "And no one else knows about it. I want the *Golden Fleece*. And I want you guys to help me find her and share her treasure, if Bannister didn't manage to take it with him."

Bowden didn't require an answer right away. "Think it over," he told them, "and give me your answer soon."
